What is Glaucoma?

Glaucoma is one of the **leading causes of preventable blindness** around the world. Glaucoma is a group of eye conditions that **can cause damage to the optic nerve** due to increase in eye pressure, **leading to vision loss and blindness if left untreated**. It is often referred to as the "**silent thief of sight**" because it typically **progresses slowly and without noticeable symptoms** until significant damage has occurred. When glaucoma remains undiagnosed and untreated, **it can finally lead to untreatable blindness**.

Method of Treating:

1. Eye Drops (Common Measure)
2. Laser (Long Term Benefits)
3. Surgery (Long Term Benefits)



Reasons for patients not returning or addressing Glaucoma

1. Poor awareness of the disease and its grave consequences
2. Costs involved for no appreciable gain since disease does not have early symptoms.
3. Compliance: not comfortable to use the eye drops daily for life.
4. Alternative health or social priorities. Since many of the patients are elderly, they depend on others for socio-economic

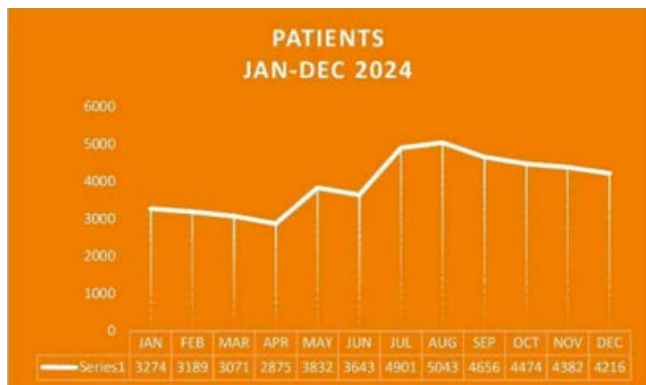

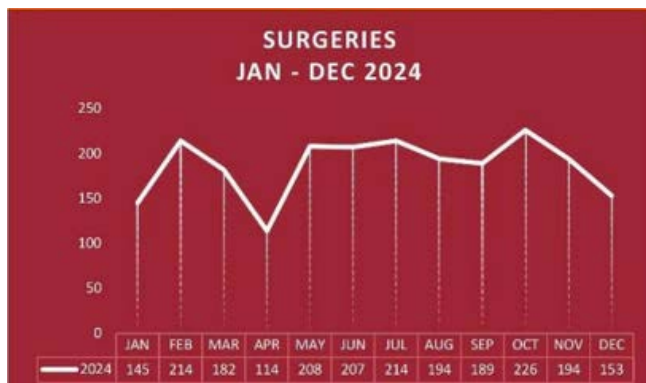
KSI Eye Clinic 2024 Annual Overview



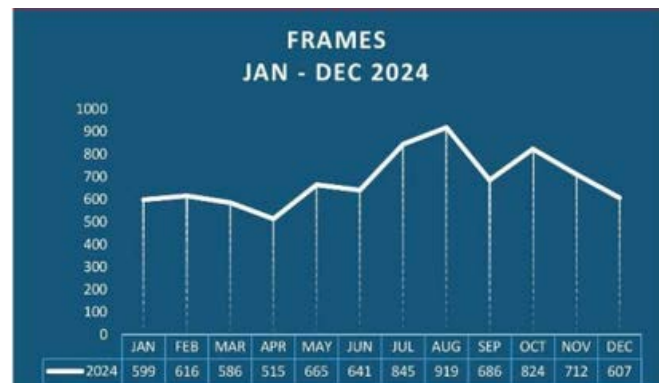
The clinic experienced an influx of patients throughout the year, with a rise from May to August. Even in the later months, patient numbers remained consistently high making a **remarkable total of 47,556** in 2024.



The clinic saw an increase in **laser-therapeutic procedures**. Lasers are essential in treating **glaucoma, cataract removal, and retinal repairs**, playing a crucial role in vision restoration and preservation. **A total of 155** patients were treated.



The clinic achieved an outstanding number of surgeries throughout the year. A total of **2,240 surgeries** in 2024 shows the clinic's ability to **consistently provide life-changing eye surgeries**, including **glaucoma surgery and cataract removal**.



The clinic's commitment to providing high-quality eye care is reflected in the steady **distribution of frames** throughout the year, ensuring patients **receive the vision support they need**. An exceptional **total of 8,215 frames** distributed in 2024 demonstrates the growing demand for accessible eyewear.

Project Impact

Through the generous support of **The Mohsin & Fauzia Jaffer Foundation**, the **Glaucoma Club scheme** at the **KSI Charitable Eye Centre** has provided life-changing assistance to **249** patients of all ages, from **10 to 91** years old. This initiative has ensured that individuals at risk of vision loss receive the critical support they need, helping them manage their condition effectively.

As the first tranche of **\$20,000** was sent from the **allocated \$80,000**, the impact has been significant. A total of **249** (141 male and 108 female) patients benefited from the donation, with many **receiving multiple forms of care**.

Among them, **75 patients** received **specialized consultations**, and **245 individuals** were provided with **essential medication to manage glaucoma** and prevent further deterioration. Additionally, some patients received other forms of support, including **diagnostic services (4 patients)**, **eyeglass frames (3 patients)**, an **AB scan (1 patient)**, and **white canes for mobility assistance (3 patients)** - All inclusive within the **Glaucoma Club Scheme**.

These efforts have played a crucial role in **improving the quality of life** for glaucoma patients, ensuring they have access to the **necessary medical support to preserve their sight**.



Financial Breakdown

The table below provides a **breakdown of the funds** utilized and patients supported through the **Glaucoma Club Scheme** across four quarters. With only **\$2,374.80** spent out of the **first tranche of \$20,000**, a total of **249 patients** received essential eye care services. This demonstrates the efficient use of resources, leaving a **remaining balance of** out of the **total of \$83,500 allocated** for continued impact.
