PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Free Eye Camp, Parachinar was a three-day medical intervention organized from 26th to 28th of September 2025 at District Headquarters Hospital (DHQ), Parachinar, KPK. The camp aimed to provide free cataract surgeries and eye consultations to underprivileged patients who lacked access to specialist care.

Thanks to the generous support of the Mohsin & Fauzia Jaffer Foundation (MFJ), this initiative successfully provided 200 free cataract surgeries and 830 free eye consultations to underprivileged patients. A team of eight medical professionals, led by Dr. Tanveer Abbas, performed the surgeries using modern Phaco techniques.

This initiative marked the first instance of advanced Phaco surgeries being performed in Parachinar, successfully restoring sight and independence to hundreds of individuals. In total, 830 people benefited, many of whom were widows and low-income laborers.

To ensure long-term impact, follow-up is being conducted with Dr.

Muhammad Saqlain at DHQ Hospital Parachinar. Patients receive checkups within 1–2 weeks for recovery, a 6-month review to assess vision stability, and a 12-month assessment to evaluate improvements in quality of life and livelihood. Regular contact with local medical staff ensures ongoing monitoring and sustained outcomes.

Beneficiaries' Stories

In the narrow lanes of Kunj Ali Zai village near Parachinar lives Ali Hussain, a 65-year-old laborer who spent his life pushing a handcart in the local bazaar to support his family of thirteen. Age and hardship had already taken their toll when cataracts clouded his vision, making even simple tasks impossible.

Unable to afford surgery, Ali feared permanent blindness, until the Free Eye Camp in Parachinar, made possible through the generous support of the Mohsin & Fauzia Jaffer Foundation (MFJ), offered him a chance to see again.

In the village of Zerhan Musa Khail, in Parachinar, Fatima Bibi, a widow and mother of five, struggled to after support her family husband's passing. With no steady she often relied income. neighbors' help to make ends meet. When cataracts blurred her vision, simple household chores even became difficult, and she feared her eyesight completely. losing During the Free Eye Camp Parachinar, supported by the Mohsin & Fauzia Jaffer Foundation (MFJ), Fatima received free cataract surgery and medicines for recovery.
