WF-AID serves as the humanitarian arm of The World Federation of KSIMC. As an NGO in Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) of the United Nations and a member of the Fundraising Regulator, WF-AID ensures transparency and accountability in its operations while maintaining a focus on delivering impactful humanitarian aid.

Since its establishment as a dedicated humanitarian brand in 2016, WF-AID has been committed to alleviating suffering and improving lives globally with the aim to focus solely on humanitarian aid and economic development. We aim to provide practical and sustainable solutions for the different challenges faced by men, women, and children around the world.

Our **vision** is to create a world free from suffering, where all human beings have access to basic human rights, like clean water, food, shelter, sanitation, education, and health

We work alongside regional federations and trusted partners on the ground, embracing a grant-giving model that empowers local organisations to deliver aid. This approach aligns with the international development sector's localisation agenda, ensuring that support reaches communities efficiently and effectively. Local partners, often embedded within the communities they serve, bring invaluable knowledge of the beneficiaries' needs and help stimulate local economies by sourcing products and services locally.

WF-AID's model also addresses key challenges faced by small, community-based organisations, such as limited capacity to communicate with international donors or meet complex reporting requirements. By conducting rigorous due diligence, ensuring funds are used responsibly, and managing comprehensive reporting processes, WF-AID bridges the gap between donors and beneficiaries, offering peace of mind to supporters and maximising the impact of their contributions.

Through our collaborative efforts in 2024, WF-AID has supported beneficiaries across many regions - South America, Africa, the Middle East, and Rest of Asia. Beyond fundraising, SJ has engaged its community through sports tournaments and charity challenges, inspiring individuals to combine their passion for fitness with meaningful humanitarian efforts. Their commitment to using sports as a platform for change aligns seamlessly with WF-AID's mission, demonstrating the profound impact that collective effort can achieve.

The **Mohsin & Fauzia Jaffer Foundation, USA** has been a longstanding and generous supporter of WF-AID, enabling us to undertake impactful projects that change lives for the better. Ramadhan Impact Overview

Ramadhan Relief 2024 aimed to ensure that families across the globe could observe the holy month of Ramadhan without the burden of food insecurity. The initiative collaborated with **52 organisations** across **20 countries** in **East Africa, South Asia, East Asia, the Middle East**, and **the Caribbean**, bringing essential support to communities in need. Through these efforts, **395,847** people were reached, and **11,726,508** meals were provided, offering vital sustenance to those facing hardship during this sacred time.

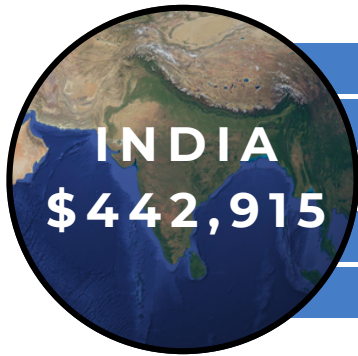

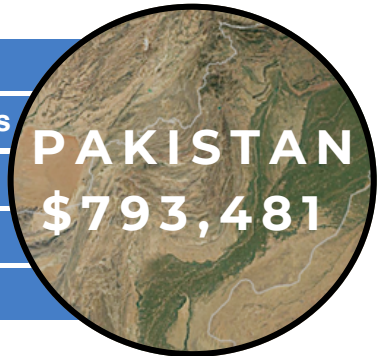

Fidya, Fitra & Kaffrah Funds Distribution

Fitra (Zakat al-Fitr): It is religious alms paid on the day when Muslims break the fasting period at the end of the month of Ramadhan.

Fidya: Fidya is paid as a compensation for a fast of Ramadhan that is missed under certain legitimate circumstances.

Kaffarah: Kaffarah is an amount to feed 60 needy people for each fast deliberately invalidated.

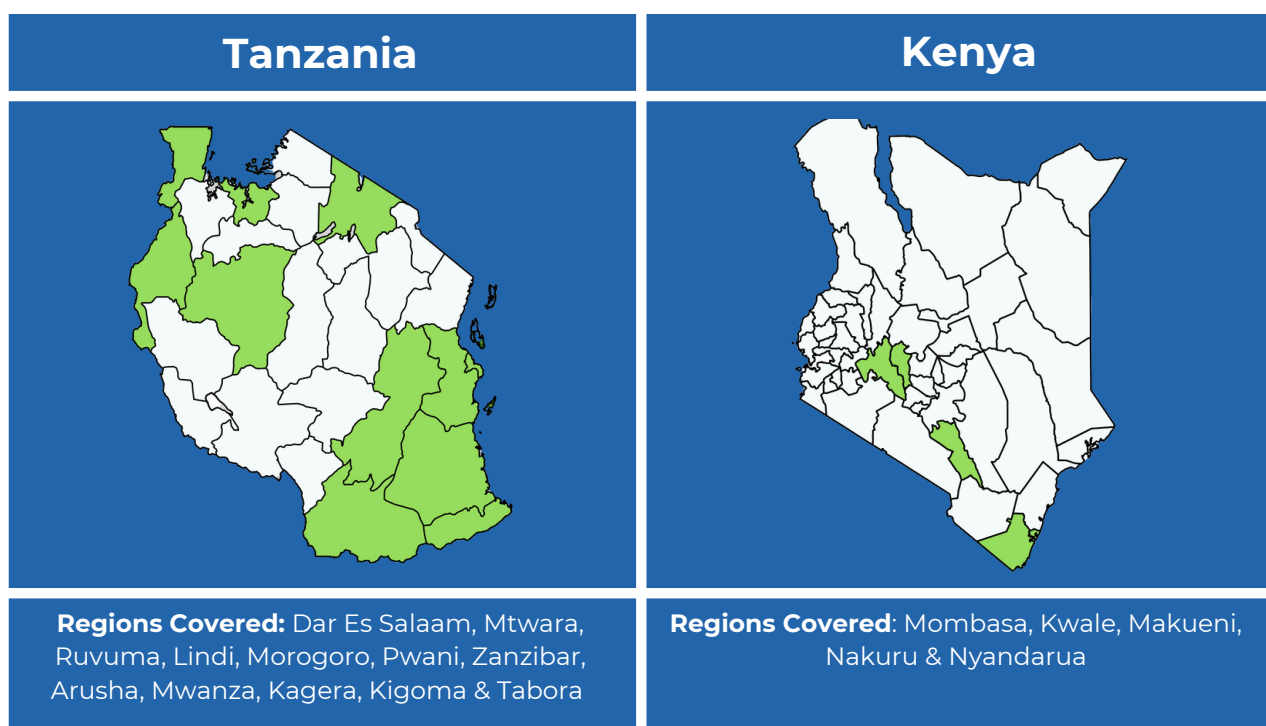

Fueling Brighter Futures, One Cup at a Time

The Fill My Cup Appeal continues to transform the lives of children **across 17 regions in Tanzania and Kenya** by providing a nutritious breakfast of porridge before they begin their school day. In 2024, thanks to your generous support, we were able to alleviate hunger, improve school attendance, and help children focus better on their studies. WF-AID funded this initiative at a cost of **\$72,531**, reducing barriers to education caused by food insecurity and positively impacting **over 5,000 beneficiaries**, laying the foundation for brighter futures.

Each highlighted region on the map below represents an area where the Fill My Cup Appeal has provided vital support. These areas reflect the reach of your generosity, ensuring children wake up to a better start each day with a nutritious breakfast that fuels their education and growth.



Case Study

Athman Matano, a six-year-old student at Al-Mujtaba – Miamba, lives with his grandmother after losing both parents. With their only source of livelihood being a small two-acre farm, his grandmother struggles to provide for their daily needs. The Fill My Cup Program has been a lifeline, significantly improving Athman’s health, ensuring he attends school consistently, and keeping him engaged in class and extracurricular activities. His grandmother is deeply grateful, as having breakfast provided at school eases her financial burden and allows her to focus on other essentials. Teachers have also noted a positive impact, with improved attendance, participation, and overall school morale. By addressing both nutrition and education, the Fill My Cup Program is giving children like Athman a stronger foundation for a brighter future.

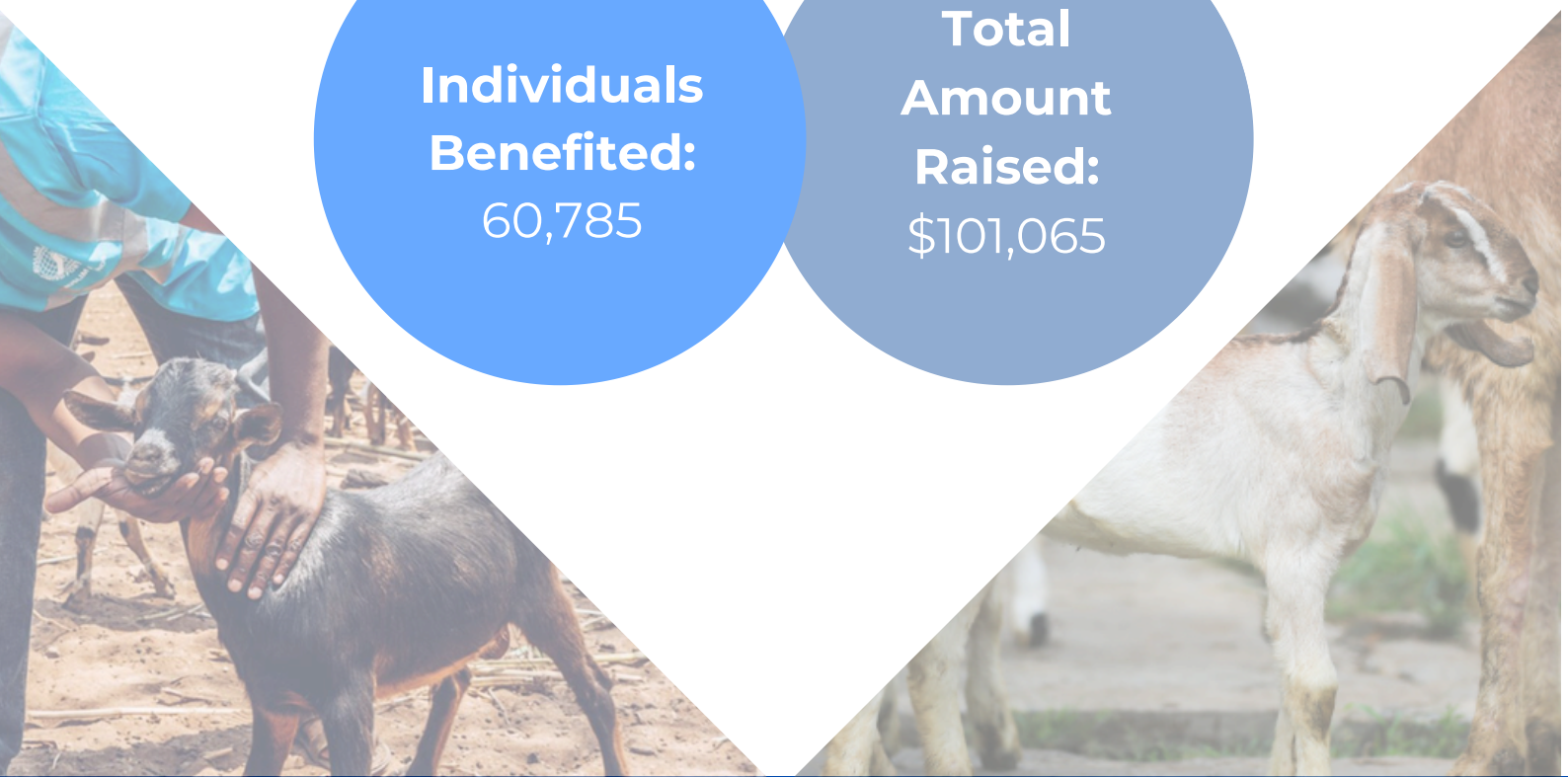

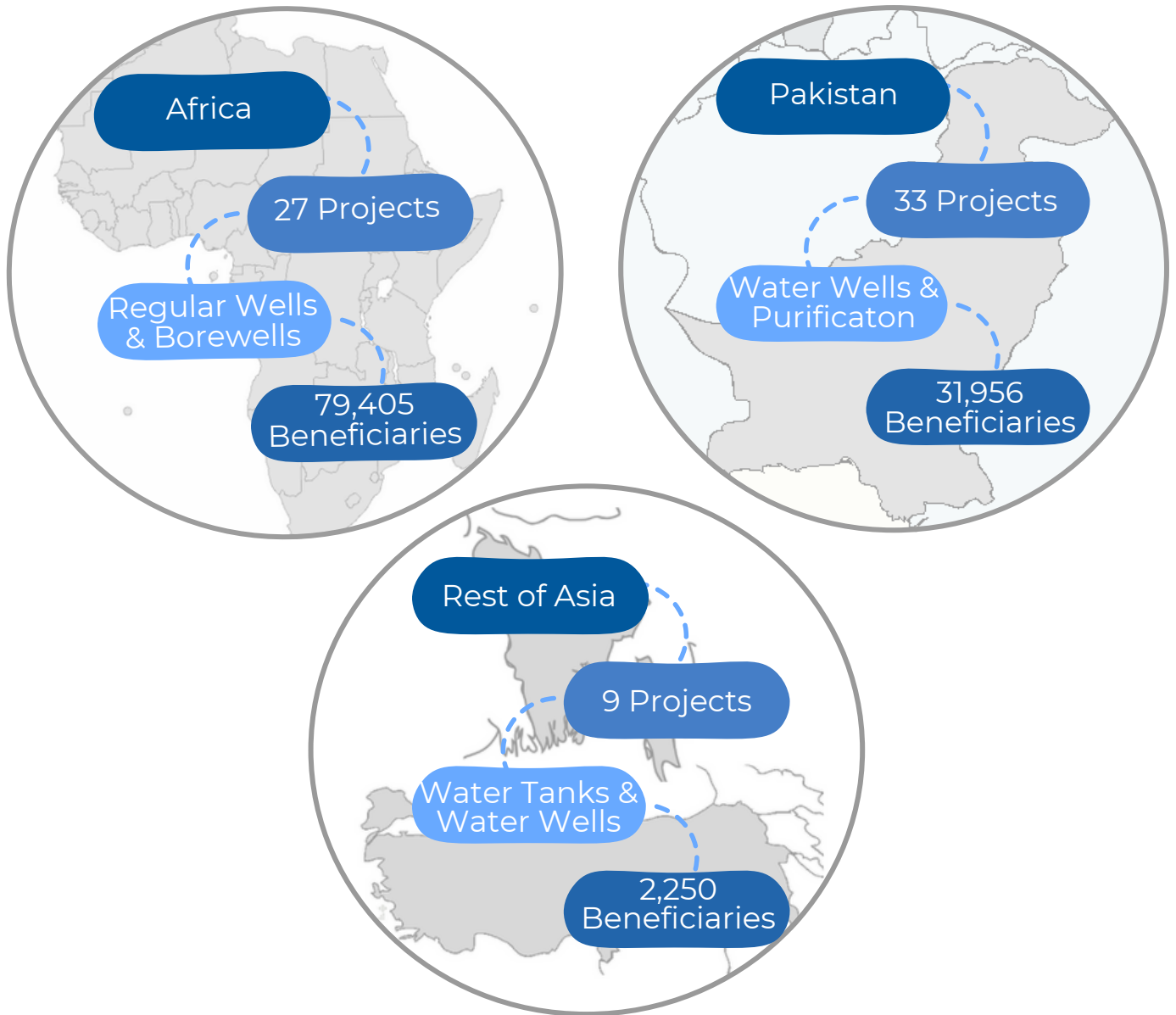

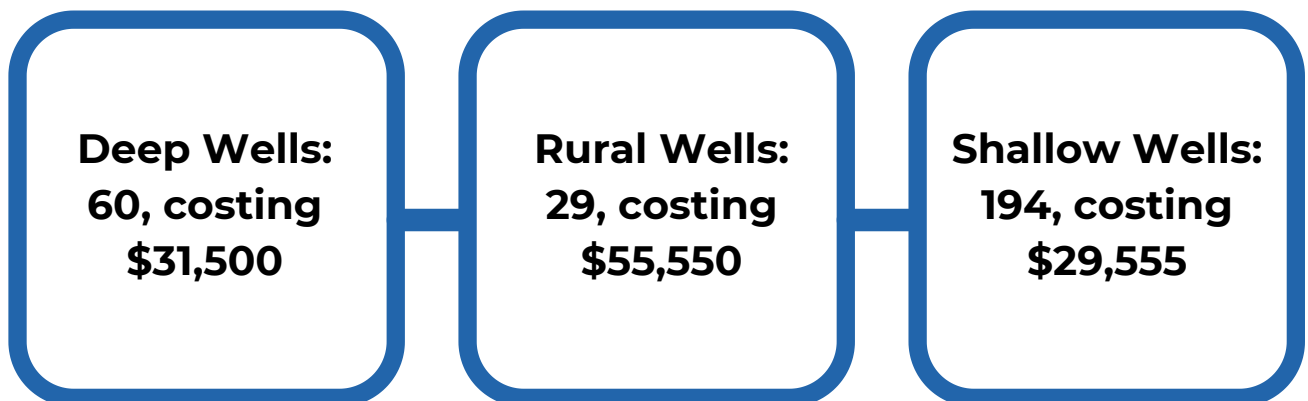

By addressing water insecurity, this initiative ensures that entire communities gain access to essential resources, paving the way for improved well-being and brighter futures for all.

Lebanon Emergency Relief

In phase 1 of Lebanon Emergency Relief, WF-AID focused its initiatives on delivering short-term, immediate relief to vulnerable families and individuals. **USD \$301,248** was delivered in the form of blankets, warm clothing, medical assistance, assistive devices, food parcels and cash assistance.

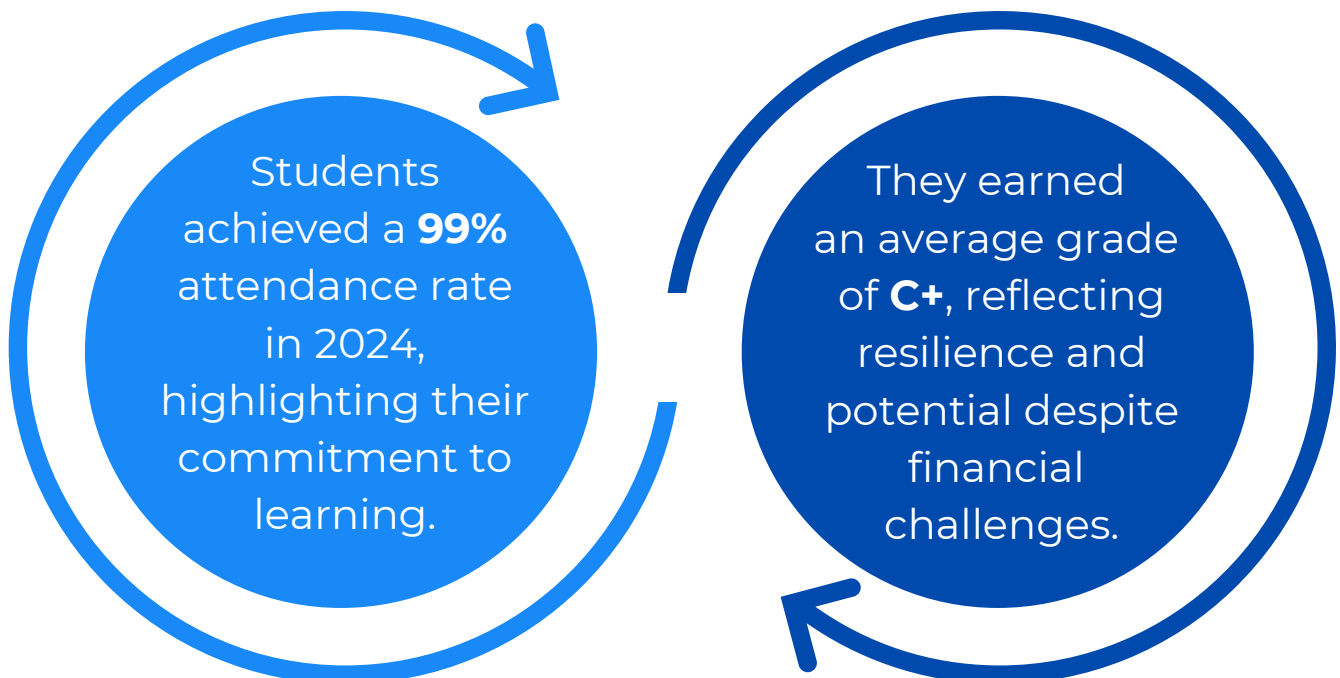
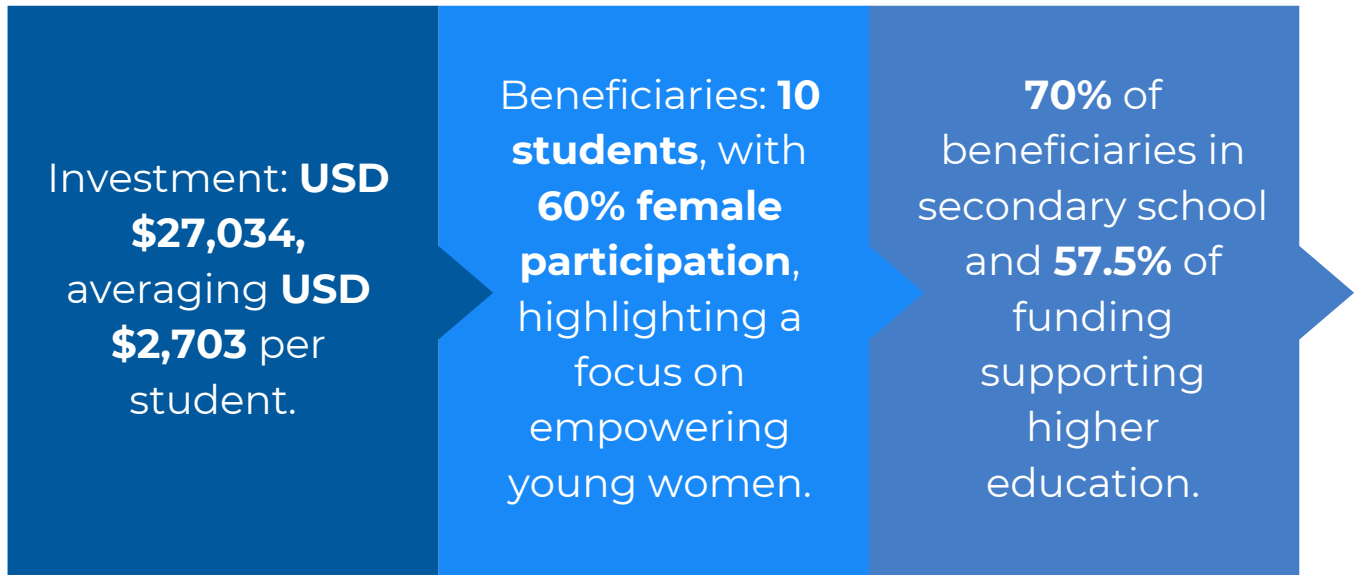


ECONOMIC UPLIFTMENT



Elimu Bora Child Sponsorship Scheme, Kenya

The Elimu Bora Sponsorship Scheme aims to break the cycle of poverty by investing in the education of financially disadvantaged students, providing them with the tools and opportunities to transform their futures. This initiative prioritises gender equity and higher education, ensuring long-term impact for individuals and their communities.



Empowering Women Through Microfinance

WF-AID's Tailoring Program empowers women by providing a two-year vocational training in tailoring, dressmaking, and design. This initiative equips participants with practical skills, enabling them to secure employment or establish their own businesses. The program ensures sustainability through donor-funded loans and grants to support graduates' ventures.

Project Cost: **USD \$72,830**, covering construction, equipment, and running costs for three classes..

Two classrooms were constructed and fully operational in **Bahakanda** and **Nzavoni** by the end of 2024, providing a dedicated space for learning and skill development.

Graduates gain financial independence by securing stable employment or starting small businesses, improving their households and communities.

This program fosters lasting empowerment, helping women sustain themselves and their families with dignity.

Economic Upliftment, Pakistan

The Economic Upliftment Project (EUP) was launched following the catastrophic 2022 floods in Pakistan, which devastated countless communities. This initiative focuses on rebuilding livelihoods by supporting families through sustainable opportunities in livestock, agriculture, and small businesses.

USD \$375,000 was efficiently allocated to address the diverse needs of affected families.

1,162 families were supported across three livelihood categories.

Livestock:
362 families received animals to support agricultural productivity and income generation.

Agriculture:
360 families received tools, seeds, and other resources to restart farming activities.

Small Businesses:
440 families were provided with the means to establish or expand small enterprises.

Regional Impact

KPK: 182 families supported

Punjab: 807 families supported

Sindh: 173 families supported

EUP plans to extend its reach to an additional **65 more families in 2025**, with a projected budget of **USD \$25,000**. By continuing to focus on sustainable livelihoods, the program aims to foster resilience, economic independence, and long-term stability for even more communities.

HEALTH & MEDICAL



Transforming Lives Through Healthcare & Medical Aid

In 2024, WF-AID allocated over \$790,000+ to healthcare initiatives, reaching over 176,000+ patients in Pakistan, India & Tanzania. These funds provided life-saving surgeries, diagnostic equipment, emergency medical aid, and hospital expansions, ensuring that the most vulnerable - orphans, widows, seniors, and low-income families - received the care they desperately needed.

Over 4,500 patients benefited from free cataract surgeries, eye screenings, and glaucoma treatments across multiple centers in Tanzania, Karachi, Mianwali, Sindh and Balochistan

\$70,000 + allocated for eye surgeries & optical care, including the donation of an Optical Laser equipment to serve 2,000-3,000 patients per month.

Hospital & Medical Facility Expansions

Fatimiyah Hospital Expansion: benefiting 120,000+ people by adding cardiology, neonatal care, and advanced medical facilities.

Zainabia Blood Bank & Thalassemia Centre: \$6,000 for Q4 2024 monthly blood transfusions, offering lifesaving care to 368 patients for those with severe blood disorders.

Fatimiyah Hospital Patient Welfare Fund: \$72,000 supported 3,349 Shia patients for outpatient consultations, lab tests, surgeries, and emergency care.

Emergency & Specialised Medical Aid

Cancer & Chronic Illness Support: \$4,500 provided for a Stage 4 Lung Cancer patient to receive radiation, chemotherapy & targeted therapy at Ziauddin Hospital.

Gynaecological Surgeries: \$9,442 funded 26 gynecological procedures, including hysterectomy & tubal ligation, ensuring critical care for women.

Seniors & Emergency Cases: \$25,800 allocated to assist vulnerable seniors with hospitalization & urgent treatments in Mumbai, India.

Clubfoot Deformity Treatment: \$12,960 helped 11 children regain mobility through corrective surgeries & rehabilitation.

Medical Aid for Vulnerable Families: \$10,248 provided healthcare assistance to 10 families, with 24 more families receiving food support.

Women Health & Hygiene Program - \$5112.4 - 1000 beneficiaries in underprivileged areas of Mianwali, Bhakkar, and Dera Ismail Khan

Fatimiyyah Hospital Expansion, Pakistan

Located centrally, Fatimiyyah Hospital serves as a crucial healthcare facility for the KPSIAJ, the largest jamaat under the Pakistan Federation with over 50,000 members. Approximately 64% of the Khoja Community in the surrounding areas benefit from its services. However, overcrowding, a lack of beds, and outdated technology remain significant challenges..

Phase Two Expansion: The ongoing expansion aims to alleviate these challenges by acquiring a new property and upgrading facilities.

In 2024 over \$400,000 of \$1.2 million was remitted to acquire a new property for the hospital.

This expansion will ensure the hospital can better accommodate the community's growing healthcare needs, improving access and quality of care.



HOUSING



Flood Recovery Housing – Badin, Sindh

The 2021 floods in Badin left many families homeless and vulnerable, with no means to rebuild.

In 2024, WF-AID allocated \$33,973 to construct 40 secure homes, providing long-term stability.

Each home offers safe shelter, protecting families from harsh weather & future displacement.

By restoring security & dignity, this project helps families rebuild their lives with hope.

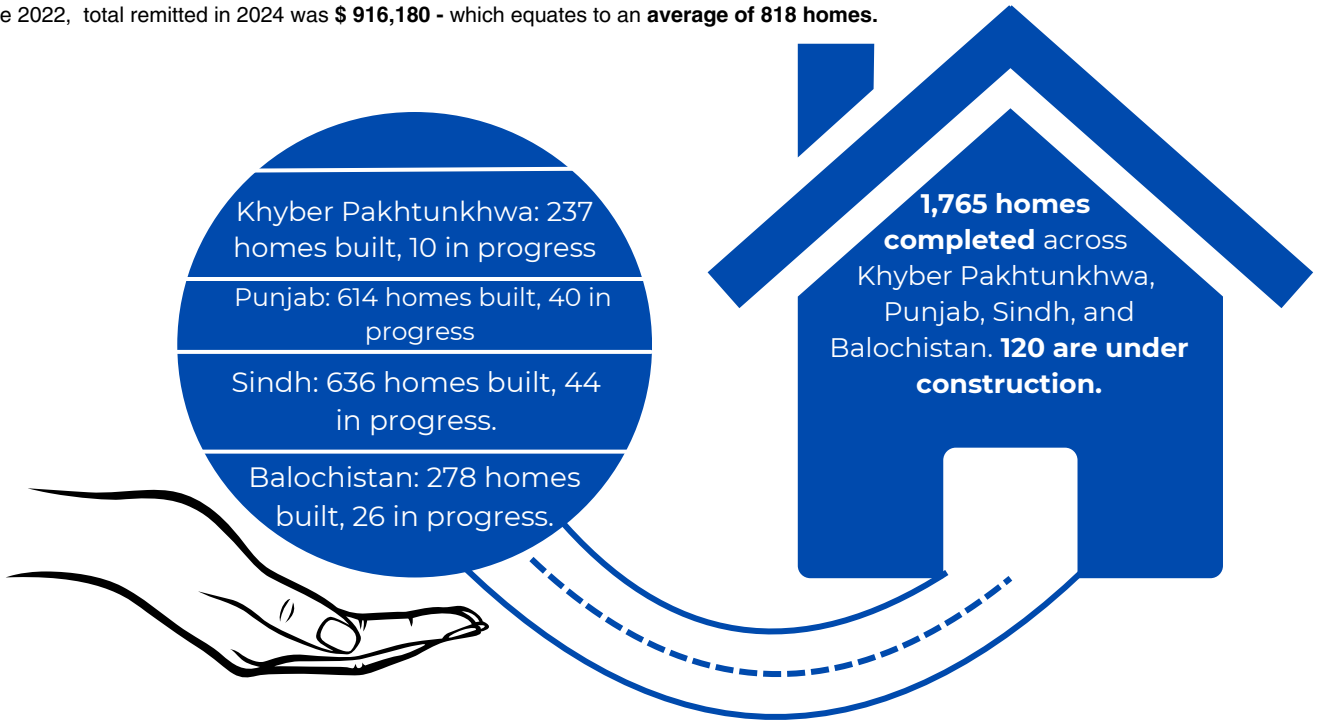
Build A Home, Congo

Funding: USD \$2,100 covered home construction, one month's ration, and clothing for the family after their house was destroyed in a fire.

Impact: The project helped a widow and her 7 children regain stability, providing them with shelter and essential supplies during a time of immense hardship.

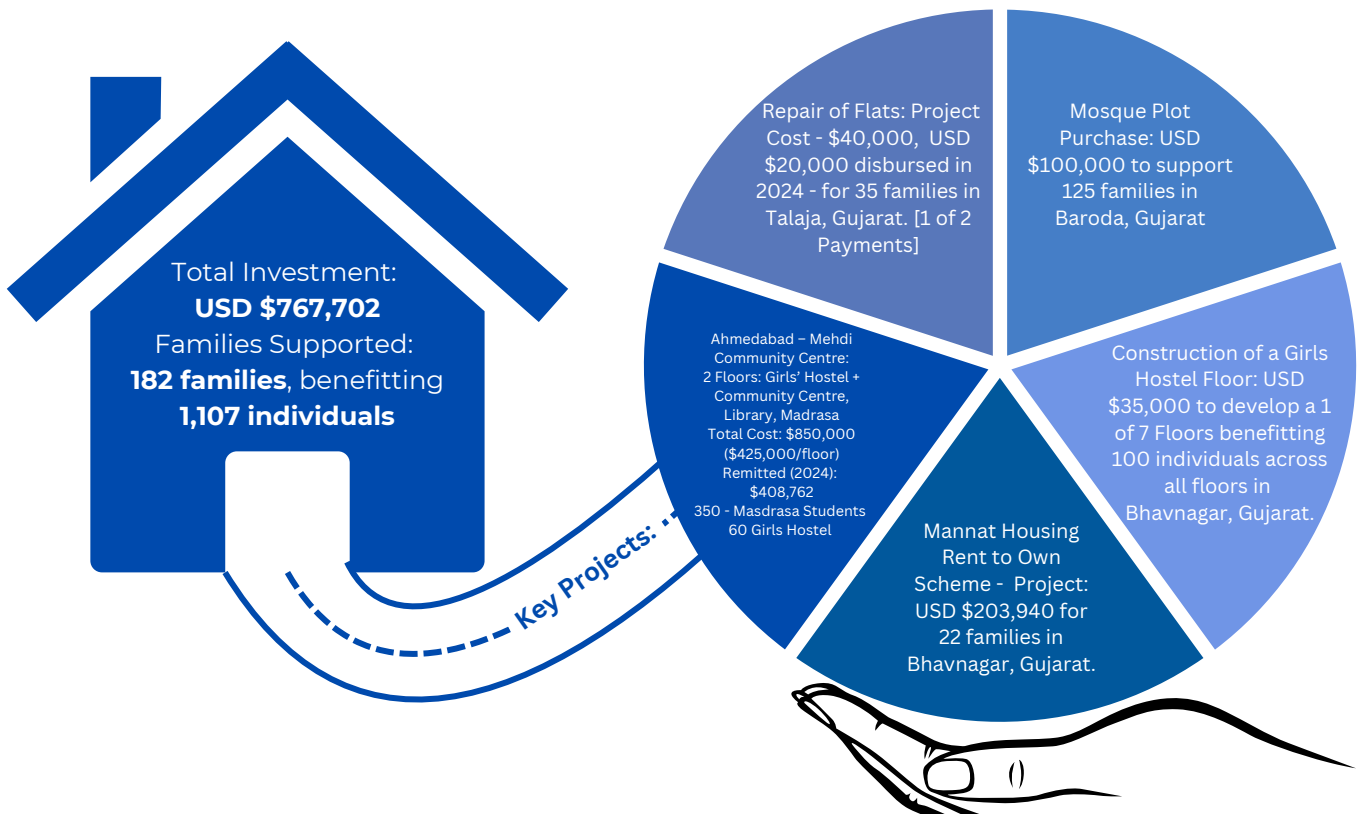
Build A Home, Pakistan

The 'Build a Home' project was launched in October 2022 following the devastating floods of August 2022 in Pakistan. This project aimed to provide durable housing for families who lost their homes in the hardest-hit regions across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab, Sindh, and Balochistan. By December 2024, a total of 1,765 homes have been completed, helping affected families to rebuild their lives. Additionally, 120 homes are currently under construction to further support those in need. The average cost of a house is \$1,120 with a total disbursement of \$2,080,094 since 2022, total remitted in 2024 was \$916,180 - which equates to an average of 818 homes.

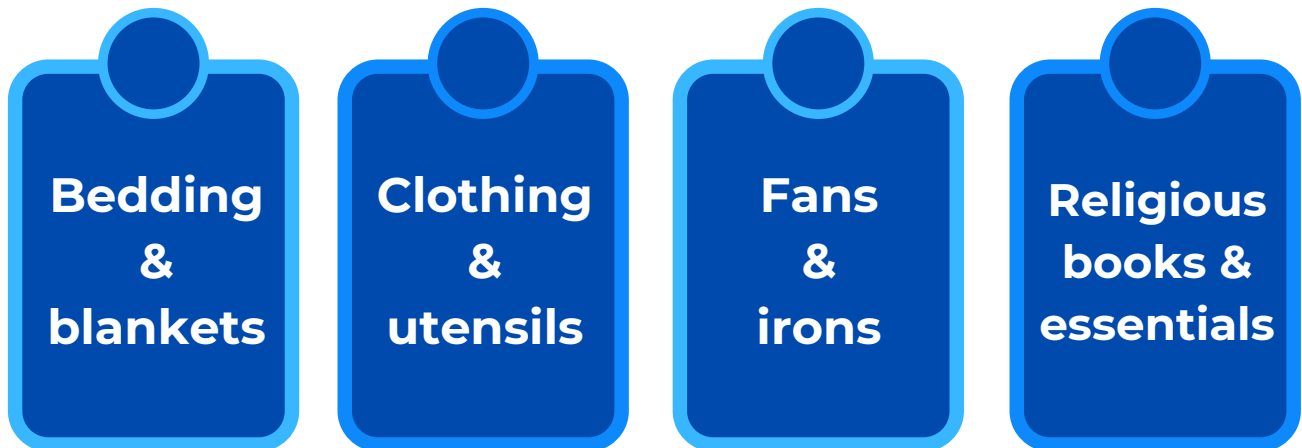
Supporting 250 Underprivileged Couples to Begin Their New Journey

In many underprivileged communities, high wedding costs prevent couples from starting their married life with stability and dignity. Families struggle to afford essential household items, making marriage an overwhelming financial burden.



What We Provided

Each couple received key household essentials to help them start their married life, including:



By removing financial barriers, through the donation of \$100,000, this initiative not only supported new families but also strengthened entire communities. With WF-AID's continued efforts, more couples can marry with dignity and security.

ZERO% ADMIN POLICY

WF-AID has an enormous responsibility in collecting your donations and ensuring they are used in the best possible way.

We take this very seriously and our aim is to ensure the longevity and growth of WF-AID, whilst having a self-sustainable operating model.

Like every charity, we have basic administration costs to support the running of charitable activities, like our education programmes, emergency relief, feeding initiatives, water solutions and other sustainable projects.

WF-AID is delighted to announce that our administration costs are projected to be entirely covered through the income generated through the Foundation Fund, a World Federation managed capital investment project.

The announcement follows years of discussion and preparation, with a final resolution presented to the Executive Council at the Triennial Conference held in May 2017.

This was passed and adopted with the following statement, 'It is hereby resolved that the administration fee charged by The World Federation on donations to projects and appeals run by The World Federation or its members or constituent members be reduced to 0% with effect from 1st January 2018'.

We understand that donors give their money with the purest of intentions, for the sake of humanity, and they can now be reassured that their money is not being used on overhead costs with our Zero% Admin Policy.

As an organisation that relies on donations to support our programmes, we wanted to ensure that any money donated by our valued donors is completely used to help deliver the chosen charitable activity.

This announcement follows years of preparation and development of a Foundation Fund, where yields generated from investments offer a sustainable method to pay ongoing admin costs.

The principle of the Foundation Fund stems from the concept of 'Waqf', an Islamic tradition where land, buildings or money is donated, and the profits are used to support charitable causes.
